#### A reminder about Club Rules for Visitors.

A visitor can enter the Club and sign in as a temporary member if they meet the following criteria:

- 1. They reside more than 5 kilometres from the Club, or
  - 2. Are a member of another golf club, or
  - 3. Are a member of another club and invited to attend an organised sporting event, or
  - 4. Can sign in as a member's guest if they are signed in by a member and stay in the company of that member.

If you reside within 5 kilometres of the Club and do not meet the criteria we need you to join as a social member. The cost is \$5 for one year or \$10 for three years. There are many benefits of being a member of the Club including loyalty points for all of your purchases at the Bar or in the Golf Shop, as well as, entry into all Club promotions and birthday vouchers. We cased the town for sponsorship and I am pleased to see some of those early sponsors are still with us.

In 1998, I suffered my first heart attack and returned to the ACT to be close to my family. I remained there until 4 years ago, again taking up membership here.

As you can see, my involvement with the Club has been over many years, however, my membership is fairly short. I may be a bit biased, but I do believe we have the finest Golf Club on the Northern Rivers BAR NONE!




#### Golf Words and their meaning.....




