Captain's Report

The Club Championships once again have been a huge success with the numbers up on the previous year. Lucas Higgins after a slow start came home too strong with his last two rounds in the sixties to finish as Club Champion with Christopher Dean coming in at runner up. It took 22 holes on the last day to decide the B Grade Champion with Tim Wright taking out the title in a play-off against Rick Souter.

The other grades were all keenly contested with Geoff Clarke taking out the C Grade and Darren Hardy too good in the D Grade. The Junior Veteran's title went to Murray Fitzpatrick and the Senior Vets to Keith O'Grady. Nicholas Sneesby took out the Junior Champions title with an easy victory.

The Earle William's Matchplay winners Peter Tomsett and Warren Goodall showed their years of experience did count in beating Tim Wright and Peter Hamill in a playoff.

During the construction of the new 6th green and the levelling of the 7th fairway a temporary tee will be used to play the Screen green as a par 3. This will mean we will play 3 par threes in a row. This will no doubt cause some hold ups in play so please be patient.

There is talk that we are not too far away from being able to ease some of the restrictions that affect our normal game of golf. Golf NSW and Golf Australia will notify us when we can change back to the normal playing conditions.

What is the difference between blade & cavity-back irons?

In terms of appearance, they are easy to tell apart. Cavity-back irons, which first appeared in the early 1960's have hollow backs and thick perimeter edges. Blade irons have smooth backs and look generally more redefined.

In a cavity-back iron the weight of the head is distributed around its extremities-the sole, heel and toe—in order to lower the club's centre of gravity and increase what's called its "inertia". This makes cavity-backs significantly more forgiving on off-centre strikes. A shot off the heel of a well designed cavity back iron will therefore perform much better than if the ball were struck from the same part of the clubface on a blade.

Most blades have a "muscle back" with the concentration of weight falling directly behind the center of the clubface.
