Shane's Slice

Pro Tip - How to play in the wet



We've certainly seen enough rain for the year, but what adjustments do you make for your game when playing in the wet? Don't think of yourself.... think of your clubs! Before you put up your umbrella or dig your rainsuit out of your bag, be sure that the top of your bag is covered. When you can't get a decent hold on the club, you can't put a solid hit on the ball. Its always advantageous to carry extra dry towels with you to make sure you can keep your grips dry.

Second, when the ball and turf are wet and the grooves of your irons are filled with water, don't expect to put much backspin on the ball. You'll get a semi-flyer shot, but you won't get more distance than usual because the weight of the rain will cancel the spinless flight of the ball. In fact, on approach shots it's generally wise to take one club more than normal and make a controlled, balanced swing to guard against slippage.

Another tip is for putting. When a ball sits in the rain for more than a few seconds, its dimples fill up with water, and the result is that you will not be able to make clean club-to-ball impact. It will slip and slide both on impact and during its initial roll. So do yourself a favour and keep the ball dry for as long as possible. This means lining up your putt with a marker in place instead of the ball. Don't set the ball down until you're ready to address and stroke the putt.

Lastly, with the frequent "preferred-lie" rule in play, how often do you set the ball up on a good lie, only to get under the ball too much, hit it high on the face and the ball comes up short!? A quick fix would be to choke down on the grip slightly and my swing thought is always to think "contact" when hitting chip shots and approaches, together with a "shallow" angle of attack. Thin to WIN!



Innovations that revolutionized Golf.....

1990s OVERSIZE DRIVERS

A news summary of the 1991 PGA Merchandise Show included a sentence easily overlooked: "Callaway had a hit with Big Bertha, an oversize stainless-steel driver..."

More than "a hit", what happened might better be described as a cultural phenomenon. The Big Bertha was a breakthrough in size. Giving Golfers a monster built for attack. The industry never shielded away from the search for bigger and better driver until the R&A and USGA slapped a limit on club-head size in the early 2000's.

At 190 cubic centimeters, Big Bertha was about 30 percent larger than most drivers at the time but nearly 60 percent smaller than they are today. The club was the idea of Callaway's design genius, Dick Helmstetter. Although told the frame would probably collapse, Helmstetter located a foundry willing to take a chance.



"I knew the design worked," he said. "I just had to find a way to get it made." He did, and by 1993 Big Bertha was the No. 1 driver on the American tours and the best-selling club of its time. Two years later, Callaway went larger still with Great Big Bertha. Made from titanium, the metal's strength allowed for thinner faces that propelled the ball in a new and faster way.

So, Big Bertha spawned not one, but two technologies that forever changed the equipment landscape.
