As we say farewell to daylight savings, our days become shorter again and pace of play will be a focus for us all to improve on during the autumn and winter months. This month's tip is about your pre shot routine; do you use one? Do you find yourself taking longer over the ball? Are you overthinking any technical thoughts when on the course? Use these tips to help you get into a better frame of mind and executing better shots!

1) Stop and think – Behind the Ball

This stage starts as you approach your golf ball when you will consider the following: your distance to target (pin or avoiding danger), the wind direction, how the ball is lying and finally your golf club selection.

PACE OF PLAY TIP: Don't wait until you get to your ball to start thinking, when your playing partner is hitting their shot, you should be at your ball already thinking of what type of shot you'll play.

2) Prepare and Rehearse - Behind the Ball

The next stage is about preparing yourself for the shot you are intending to play. Take a practice swing from behind the ball facing your target. Then step into the address position, aim your club face to the target *first*, and then align your feet accordingly. Limit your practice swings to 2 maximum.

3) Execute the shot

This is the point when many people freeze over the ball with lots of thoughts running through their mind. Once you're over the ball, the key in this step is to have a trigger - so get set over the ball and FIRE! The purpose of playing golf is to swing with your unconscious mind, try to have one swing thought at the most. A lot of top-level tour pros say they are thinking of "nothing" when over the ball because they are more reactive to their target.

4) Evaluate the shot – Post shot routine

Once you have completed the first three steps of the pre-shot routine take your glove off (if you wear one), walk and consider the following questions: Did you commit to your intention? Did you swing with good tempo? The golf pre-shot routine isn't something you can just apply overnight; you need time to practice and perfect it on the practice range before you take it to the course.

Take some time to plan



your pre-shot routine and take it out for a test run on the course before you finally add it to your game in tournament play. For this routine to be effective you need to practice before you apply it!

Golf Fees Increase in Murwillumbah to Maintain Course - 1962.

The annual general meeting of Murwillumbah Golf Club on Wednesday night decided to increase the fees of members, associates and social members. Members' fees are increased from £5/5/- to £7/7/-, associates from £3/3/- to £4/4/- and social (non-playing) members from £3/3/- to £4/4/-.Country members' fees are unchanged at £1/10/- and juniors' fees remain at £1/1/ a year. The treasurer, Mr. J.C. Proudfoot, told members the increased funds were needed mainly for course maintenance. He proposed a £3/3/- increase in members' fees.



He said the committee also would consider improving bar service, possibly by employing stewards. He said: "There is no question. We have to increase the fees for continued progress. We can not improve the course at the present rate, otherwise. Last year we spent £1800 on course development. It is obvious we cannot run the club any longer on two green keepers, who are being worked into the ground.

We have to seriously consider the staffing of the bar. We need some paid labour. The volunteers have done all they can. Mr. Proudfoot said subscriptions were last raised in 1952 and there had been no need to increase them until now. The retiring club president Mr. E.M. Ring, said that if membership fees were increased to £8/8/- for members, he would expect a great improvement in club facilities and service.

The club had made a profit of £6,278 in the past three years. He did not believe such a large increase in members' fees was justified at this stage. The club was losing on the course and gaining on the clubhouse. He said the club should have fixed a joining fee in 1959 when membership was little more than 100, instead of raising fees now when membership was about 400. Mr. R. Flynn moved the fees for members be increased by £1/1/- to £6/6/-. He said a three guinea rise was "enormous and should not be considered without an increase in service. Mr. J.E. Smyth and Mr. E.J. Williams were among speakers opposing the £3/3/- increase.

Mr. Williams, a past club president said the clubhouse would not be needed without the course. Better facilities were needed inside the clubhouse. As a member of the committee, he believed the club should consolidate now, rather than attempt too many improvements. The chairman of the greens committee Mr. P. Glynn said the club could not continue to maintain the course with two green keepers only. After long debate, members eventually adopted an amendment for a two guinea rise from Mr. N. McDonald, who advocated "a middle course".

NET PROFIT

The statement of receipts and expenditure for the year ended October 31, 1962, showed a net club profit for the year of £2784, an increase of £693 on the previous year. Increases in income included £200 from

bar trading and £177 from subscriptions. Income from green fees showed the club received £9 more in mid-week green fees last year than from weekend green fees the year before. Mid-week fees increased from £791 to £947 and weekend fees from £938 to £1148. Course maintenance costs increased from £218 in 1961 to £730 last year, and cleaning costs from £250 to £453.

The first term of Junior Coaching Clinics is about to come to an end. We had a great turn out with 25 junior golfers participating. Sunday mornings kids 5-9 class has been a lot of fun, some of the kids had never played golf before and are now playing a mini course that I set up on the practice range. They have developed various skills such as chipping and putting through game-based learning and different skills challenges.

Wednesday afternoon had to be split into 2 separate classes due to the numbers of beginner and advanced players. With the beginner class we focus on the same game-based learning and skill development, they are also playing the short course on the practice fairway and making connections between the games we play and shots you need to play golf. The advanced class are kids who have been playing golf or have been to last years clinic. With this class I have worked more on specific skills such as putting and chipping and how the body works in the golf swing as well as developing their swing.

The Jeb Hunter Memorial, our Annual Junior Tournament, was held on Sunday March 19th. We had a bigger field this year due to the weather making it easier to schedule, thirty 18 hole players and twenty 9 hole players, unfortunately our 5 hole field was taken out with illness. Murwillumbah Golf Club was well represented with Harrison Wood in the 18 hole event, Hayden Bray, Jack Cupitt, Ty Southon and Rowan Rekhy all playing the 9 hole event with Hayden finishing runner up!

Congratulations to Elly Petersen who shot a very impressive 4 under par 69 and was crowned the overall winner. Elly has now won the event 4 times in a row!

A special mention to all the parents and to Bill and Carol Quantrill for volunteering on the day, your help is greatly appreciated!
