### Congratulations to Murwillumbah Old Boy's Social Golf Club 50th Anniversary

On the 9th August 1973 a meeting was held at the Imperial Hotel in Murwillumbah where office bearers were elected and the Murwillumbah High School Old Boys Social Golf Club was formed.

The original committee consisted mainly of members of the MHS Old Boys Rugby League Club and the Cudgen Headland Surf Lifesaving Club who met most afternoons at the pub for a cleansing ale or five. Peter Dimond, former Australian Rugby League winger, was the publican of the Imperial Hotel. Some of the original committee were Bill McGuinness (President), Dick Branscombe (Secretary/Treasurer), Brian Shapland (Captain), Tom Curd, Merv Gorton, Ray Mather, Peter Gielis, Percy Delaney and Peter Dimond (committee members).

Of course, all were interested in a game of golf on a Saturday morning. In those days the golf club competition commenced at around 11.30am so there was plenty of scope for a social group to tee off at daylight. Initially Old Boys played a 9 hole comp but the hard core golfers amongst the group yearned to play 18. In the late 1970's there were both 9 hole and 18 hole comps.

The joining fee was \$2, competition fee \$2 and if you didn't wear your Old Boys shirt it was a \$2 fine. Accounting for this cash was fairly blasé in the early days and the joining fee and shirt fines were consumed by the President and Captain at the MGC bar. The competition winner took home a pair of new long socks and there was a small ball rundown.

How times have changed.

In the 9 months until the end of September 2023, revenue was \$25808 and expenditure \$19868.

In 2023 we have played 1377 rounds of golf and paid out \$8480 in prizes to Members. (Inc winners, runners-up, NTP, Eagles, Ball rundowns) plus \$5300 in raffle prizes.

In 2018 the committee decided to start a 50 Lotto to assist with raising money for the 50th Anniversary celebrations. Chappy elected himself as chief 50 Lotto organizer and from 2018 until today a total of \$16,500 has been raised. Great work Chappy!!!

Old Boys are pleased to announce that three new life members have been elected. Pat Thompson from Murwillumbah District Plumbing Service, Mal Donnelly from Mal Donnelly Electrical and Bryan Moore from Surfside Pools (Commercial). All three are rusted-on Old Boys Members and Sponsors.

We played 5 of the most beautiful but challenging courses in Australia including 13th Beach (River and Beach courses), Lonsdale Links, Barwon Heads and The Dunes. Whilst we only had 2 very short rain and sleet showers the whole time, we did have strong winds every day except one which sent us home feeling very "beaten up" as the courses proved very difficult for most. One outstanding round was played by Glenn Veares at 13th Beach Creek course in winds blowing up to 50kph where he had 38 points and wiped the last with a shot. I witnessed this round first hand and I think it was one of the best use of bump and run Links Golf I have seen. I think Tom Watson would have been proud.

The pick of the courses for me was Barwon Heads, a private members course which allows visitors in very restricted time slots only. Absolute beautiful Golf Course with a magnificent old Club House built in 1937 in a "Hampton's" style.

Photo to the right shows how grand the building is from the outside, and inside is just as beautiful. As these courses play difficult in still conditions, they became very exciting in strong winds.

They do have a lot of snakes on these courses and with the wind there was a lot of searching in long grass and bushland which was interesting tiptoeing around. Whilst the scoring was poor mostly, we all had a great time with good food, good mateship, nice beers and in some occasions way too much red wine.....

There is no doubt we will do something similar next year and I can recommend the areas for a golf trip as there are many courses to choose from.




# The Fairway Sessions — End of an Era
