Chairman's Report

At the March Board Meeting the board reviewed the previous 10-year Master Strategic Plan which covered the period March 2014 to March 2024. I am pleased to report that we have completed a majority of the objectives which were set in the areas of the course, club house and operations well ahead of schedule. It was decided at that same board meeting that later this year we will again undertake a



major think tank and prepare a new master plan for the next 10 years. We will be inviting representatives from the Women's and Veterans sections of the club as well as some employees. Unfortunately, it is not practical to have such a planning session open to all members, but if you believe that you have ideas that we should look at I encourage you to contact one of our Directors and share your ideas with them so that your ideas can be raised at the meeting. It is our intention to present a draft master plan at the Annual General Meeting (AGM) in November and then, once approved, place it on our web site for all to see.

Members have reported that there are certain elements within the Club membership that are highly critical of the current condition of the course and are blaming the course staff for not doing a satisfactory job. Some have even been abusive to the course staff. The fact of the matter is that the recent weather conditions has resulted in the souring of the soil in some areas and the encouragement of fungal problems. This is not a problem just at Murwillumbah, all courses in the Northern Rivers and south east Queensland are experiencing these problems. The club has a zero-tolerance policy to any abusive or harassment behavior. If you witness any such behavior, please report it immediately to either the Club Manager Gary Thatcher or one of our Directors. We will not accept or condone such behavior. If a member has a comment or question about the course the matter should be taken up with a director or the Club Manager and not with any of the staff.

In March we conducted a survey of our operations and I am pleased to report that the golf course, proshop and club facilities all rated very highly as either good or excellent. There was a mixed result in the survey in the restaurant area. The Board and Management are having on-going discussions with the caterer to address the issues raised and to improve the standards in this area. Graphs of the survey results are in this newsletter.

By the time that you read this newsletter Easter will have come and gone and on behalf of the Board, Management and Staff we hope that you had a great Easter break. Day light savings ends on Sunday 7th April this year and I know that some of our members from across the border will give a sigh of relief for being back in the same time zone.

Dallas McCabe's Memories

I have been a member of MGC since the early 1970's. I played as a junior on Saturday mornings under Una Morrin's (Neville's mum) junior program, there always was a good roll up of boys and girls. I let my membership lapse in 1978 when I had my children then rejoined in 1986.

Through the late 80's, 90s and early 2000's I represented the club in Gold Coast and Northern Rivers pennants.

I would probably say the greatest highlight of my golfing years was when myself, Jan Williams, Val Argall and Kay Croft won the National Spalding Teams event in 1998. Murwillumbah was the NSW representative for the national title in Melbourne. We were flown business class and met women's golf professional Jan Stephenson on the plane who wished us all good luck. We played in the pro-am field of the Australian Women's Open at Yarra Yarra on the 1st day and at Kingston Links on 2nd day. We finished 26pts ahead of 2nd place and I won the individual title.

The best aspect of being a member of MGC have been the many friends I have made over the years and the numerous social occasions from going away with groups of ladies to tournaments, birthdays or just any excuse for a get together. Not to forget my long association with my mixed foursomes partner Tony Jenkins, I think we could be going on 28 years together turning up to play that fearsome game, could be some sort of record.

The course has changed a lot over the years, some interesting golf challenges on the layout before the land was purchased over near the cane fields. "Lovers Lane" (5th hole now) was always a daunting tee shot, a par 4 teeing off where men's blue markers are now through a very narrow lane of trees, always breathed a sigh of relief when you got past that one. The 2nd tee box was to the right of where it is



now on 15th fairway and ladies would either hit over the tree or run a shot under it (needless to say the tree was a lot smaller than now). Hitting off the par 4 10th where practice nets are now, cross your fingers you didn't hit the big tree on the right or hook your shot left out of bounds onto the road. Then up the hill to hit off for the par 3 where machinery shed is now. There were some great holes on the old layout.

Having played at quite a number of different golf courses I have to say Murwillumbah is one of the best. We are very lucky, so a big thankyou to all staff and members past and present who have made it such a wonderful place to play golf and socialise.


