Chairman's Report

Club House

By now members will have noticed the new stools, chairs and tables in the club house and we would appreciate your feedback on these.

We are currently awaiting quotes on the new TAB area, once built it will also allow us to increase the general lounge area for the comfort of all members.

Car Park

A number of members have recently been asking about the status of the car park and buggy storage works that I have mentioned in previous newsletters and we are still awaiting approval from the council. The delay for this is due to a number of specialists reports we have had to obtain, including engineering issues that may affect the indigenous tree species and other matters. We are hopeful that we will receive approval in the not-too-distant future. Once we receive the DA approval, we will need to finalise the plans so that they conform with the DA and then we will be able to call for tenders. So the reality is that we are unlikely to start building for several months yet.

June Board Meeting

At the June Board meeting we resolved to develop a directors display to be located at the clubs main entrance. This display will detail the portfolios of each director and provide a contact email address. The purpose of this is to encourage communication between the membership and the Board and give you the member the opportunity of putting a face to the various directors and a means of contacting them with any issues or ideas that you may have.

The strategic planning session that I mentioned in the May newsletter took place on Sunday 30th June 2024 and the results of the session will be released at the AGM in November for comment.

The Board approved the purchase of a new greens roller and a small excavator. The excavator will be used to undertake works around the course which will assist in drainage and other works. This will provide the Club with ongoing savings in labour costs as well as hiring costs.

I am pleased to advise that the Board resolved to sponsor Lucas Higgins again. Many of the playing members already know that Lucas is our touring professional golfer and we are all in awe of his playing ability. Lucas will soon be offering a number of free clinics and providing tips to improve your game for our playing members. Shane Miley and Duncan Crilley in the pro-shop also will be continuing with their lessons and clinics and I recommend that you take advantage and book in with them for lessons.

End of Financial Year

As mentioned in the June newsletter the membership renewals for playing members were issued and I am pleased to advise that the majority of members renewed on or before 30th June and took advantage of the early bird discount. In addition to the renewals, we have also had a lot of new members join up in recent months.

The end of the financial year has come again and the auditors have completed stage one of their audit process. The final audit will happen in the coming months and the financial years accounts will be published and available before the AGM in November.

Shane's Slice

With the sun returning to "normal," the golfers are out! Great to see huge player numbers back on the course. With that comes some pace of play challenges during the shorter days. Here's my top 3 ways to improve pace of play:

- **Don't wait in the cart for your partner.** The driver should drop him or her off, then go to their ball and get ready for your shot. If you want to leave the cart, that's fine, too, but take a couple clubs and start walking. Nothing wastes more time than sitting in the cart watching someone else play.
- **Park your cart at the back of the green, closest to the next tee.** It's a massive waste of time when the group behind is waiting to hit their approach shot, but the group in front walks back towards the group waiting to hit safely. By parking your cart behind the green as opposed to the front of the green, this will ensure players behind can hit safely.
- Once the first putt is holed, move to the next tee. If you are losing your position in the field, to help catch up, the first two players to hole out should move to the next tee and tee off while the other two players finish out their putts.
- **BONUS TIP:** In a stableford round, pick up your ball once you've run out of shots on the hole! The difference between a 4-hour round and 4 ½ hour round isn't so unachievable as it seems....

If you can save one minute per hole, that will equate to 18 minutes per round.



It is the duty of every golfer to keep up with the game in front and not just ahead of the game behind.

Bird of the Course - Olive-backed Oriole

Slender oriole with slender pinkish bill, streaked white underparts and narrow white tip to grey tail. Male: bright yellow-green above, greenish-grey throat. Female: dull olive above, streaked throat. Less sociable the Figbird but often feeds and nests with them. Voice: loud sneezing "chee-et", low whistling "olly-oh", beautiful varied whisper song including mimicry: hollow chuckle: loud hiss like Satin Bowerbird.

Tree of the Course - African Tulip Tree

(Spathodea campanulate) *Evergreen/fast growing *Loves hot weather *Height to 17m.

The popularity of Uganda's Spathodea campanulate has been proved by its adoption as a street tree right around the warm belt of the world. Spathodea goes by many popular names in southern USA, the Caribbean, eastern Australia and Hong Kong.

Easy to propagate from seed. The leaves are large, ruffled and compound. Flowers are a vivid orange-scarlet lined with yellow and may be 10 cm in diameter. They appear in large clusters at the ends of branches and the display lasts months.
