Count Yogi - The best golfer you've never heard of.....

Count Yogi could break 70 playing either right-handed or left-handed.

He had 55 holes-in-one, and in the 1934 Chicago Open he made two of them back to back, the first on a Par 3, the second on a Par 4.

He shot in his 50's three time in Open Competition. One day he played 18 holes in 57 minutes and shot 69. Another time, he played seven rounds in a single day, shooting in the 60s in every round. He once hit a ball 435 yards. (397 metres)

He is the mysterious Count Yogi. Banned from golf by the PGA of America (as much for his strident views as his non-Caucasian heritage) he did barnstorming exhibitions and taught the game, exhorting his pupils to set up with their hands well back and left elbow bent, to pick every shot cleanly, and above all to play the game with grace and elegance.

Count Yogi died in 1990. His real name was Harry Frankenberg, and his ethnicity was mixed, including both Jewish and Native American heritage. The PGA excluded those considered non-Caucasians from membership and touring pro status until the early 1960s.

On September 16th this year, club stalwart Ray Brims achieved a major milestone marking 50 years as a member of Murwillumbah Golf Club.


Ray, the tireless keeper of scores, handicaps and club fixtures, joined the club in 1974. He immediately embraced the Game of Golf and involved himself in the inner workings of the Board, giving generous time to improve the course, particularly in sub soil drainage.

This involvement had him work with volunteers Ray Lowe Snr, Peter Border & Ron Morse to mention a few, working on major earthworks, changing the outlay of the course when extra land was purchased in the late 60's and 70's, to construct holes, 12th, 13th, 14th & 16th as they are played today.

Ray also worked with Club Patron Mark Biltoft & Don Baxter making many trips to Don's Limpinwood property to collect bush rocks which were used to build the current 1st, 4th, 10th & 18th tees.

Ray served on the House Committee from 1983 to 1985 and served as Captain from 1986 to 2000. He was on the Northern Rivers District Golf Association's Committee for 25 years, working closely with Earl Scurr & Jim Orman conducting course ratings on many district courses.

After retiring from the Board Ray helped out with the club's weekly meat raffles until retiring about 2



For many years Ray took an interest in Junior Golf, travelling to many venues with junior golfers and in their interest gained accreditation as a level golf coach.

Thanks Ray & all past & present volunteers for your tireless dedication to enable us to play on our pristine course.



Pro Shop Report

Pro Tip - How to hit the 60m wedge shot

1. Assess the Shot

Knowing what the ball can do from your lie is the first step, if the ball is sitting down, it will be hard to loft thew ball high with spin. Think of total distance (carry/total), pin position (front/back/how much green to work with), green conditions (hard/soft) and wind (down/into). You need to decide if you will be going high, low, with or without spin. Sometime the carry distance is more important than the total distance if the greens are firm.

2. Choose the Shot

Some golfers think to automatically go for the lob wedge, but its not always the best choice. For me I usually select my sand wedge, only select a lob wedge if the pin is in the front and I need to loft the ball high. Secondly and possibly the most important factor is to never hit your wedge with 100% power. By swinging harder you'll put more spin on the ball, the ball will flare up into the air and come up 10 or more metres short of the green! Always swing with about 60-70% power.

3. Hit the Shot

Some simple tips on how I hit a 60m wedge shot are:

- stand closer to the ball and grip down the shaft 1 inch for more control
- Always keep your weight on your front during the shot
- Abbreviate your backswing and forward swing (never overswing!)
- Turn your body, chest and shoulders with limited wrist hinge
- Don't "lift" the ball, you need to hit down on it to create the spin

ROYAL SPOONBILL (Plata lea regia) 75-80cm

Spoonbills are white, long-legged, deepwater waders, with long spatulate bills. They feed by wading slowly, swishing their bill from side to side, relying on hair-trigger reflexes to snap up any aquqtic creature they find. They fly with their neck and bill extended. They build large cup-shaped nests in trees.

White spoonbill with black bill and long plumes on head. At close range, you may notice a yellow spot over the eye and red patch on the forehead. Common throughout Northern and Eastern Australia, wherever suitable water

YELLOW TRUMPET TREE 1st/16th Fairway

A semi evergreen/semi deciduous tree from Brazil. In Mexico the wood is used in the construction of buildings and the leaf infusion can be taken orally for diabetics and stomach pain. A strong leaf and root decoction is taken orally as a diuretic to treat syphilis or for intestinal worms.


