



## Chairman's Corner



Hope everyone has had a great Christmas and New Year break and are now refreshed and ready to face the challenges of 2026. The club continues to trade well and the new caterers are proving very popular with members. Our social membership numbers are continuing to grow strongly and we have quite a number of people on our waiting list for golfing membership.

We are still waiting for approval from Council for the eastern car park works but we are hopeful that now that the holiday season is at an end that the approval will be coming our way soon. The engineering, landscaping and other plans for this area are close to finalization and will be ready to be lodged for the Construction Certificate (CC) process as soon as the development application (DA) has been approved.

The DA for the new cart sheds on the existing driving range has been lodged and we are well underway refining the plans to meet the growing needs of our membership. When the DA plans are approved by Council, we will still need to lodge detailed engineering and structural plans for a CC.

We will be calling for tenders for each of these areas when the plans are finalized and approved by council.

### In The Club House

As mentioned above the new caterers at the Club are proving to be very popular and the only complaint, we are hearing is about the seating on the white chairs. The good news is that we have now ordered new chairs and some new tables from the same supplier of the wooden chairs and we are expecting them in the next few months.

We have plans afoot to increase the lounge area of the club for the convenience of members and their guests but this can only be done after we have completed the cart storage areas on the existing driving range as we need to relocate some stored equipment from the back office and cool room areas down stairs to the area under the deck where carts are currently stored.

### On the Course

Cart paths and bunker upgrades will continue to be the major improvements to the course throughout 2026 but we are still working behind the scenes on flood mitigation plans to minimize disruption and increase playing times while also maximizing cart usage on the course.




Enjoy gentle acoustic music from **5:30pm**, the perfect accompaniment to a relaxed and memorable dining experience. *See the menu displayed to the side.*
